



Terra Andina Varietal Carmenère 2007 Wins Great Gold Medal in the Concours Mondial De Bruxelles

Terra Andina has done it again! In addition to its recent triumph in the Catad'Or Grand Hyatt Wine Awards 2008, it now adds a Great Gold Medal for its Terra Andina Varietal Carmenère 2007 in the II Concours Mondial de Bruxelles Chile 2008. This wine from the brand's emblematic grape was the only varietal-level winner of a Great Gold Medal.

A hundred Chilean and Latin American companies gathered in Valparaíso between September 30 and October 3 to participate in the II Concours Mondial de Bruxelles Chile 2008. Terra Andina's performance was outstanding, and it won the Great Gold Medal for the varietal defined as the brand's emblem grape.

The decision was made by a select 17-member jury composed of 10 international and 7 Chilean judges who blind-tasted and evaluated more than 300 Chilean and international wines.

Terra Andina Carmenère 2007 was arguably the biggest winner of the competition as it was the only varietal wine among the eight Great Gold Medal winners. The majority of the others were significantly more expensive Reserve level wines: Coyam (Emiliana), Reserva Shiraz (Santa Alicia), Amaral Sauvignon Blanc (MontGras), MR (Viña Ravanal), Toro de Piedra Reserva Carménère Cabernet Sauvignon (Viña Requiñua), Sideral (Altair Vineyards & Winery), Reserva Especial Chardonnay (Viña Tabalí).

This new award comes on the heels of the Gold Medal that Terra Andina Varietal Carmenère 2007 recently received in the Catad'Or Grand Hyatt Wine Awards 2008.

This winning wine is the result of the combination of the excellent work done in the vineyards and winery by Terra Andina's team and a selection of the finest grapes from renowned Chilean wine regions. Fruity and easy to drink, Terra Andina Varietal Carmenère 2007 offers a very interesting blend of pleasing ripe black fruit aromas and flavors such as blackberries and blueberries, along with black pepper, red peppers. The rich, silky texture, tremendous balance, and soft, ripe tannins extend on to a pleasingly fresh finish.

The Concours Mondial de Bruxelles is one of the world's most important wine and spirit competition and is an international referent of quality. Its success is based on its broad experience, rigorousness, and recognized prestige in the world of wine.

This latest achievement for Terra Andina, confirms the tremendous level of its wines and the excellent price-to-quality ratio. Terra Andina has placed a priority on working with the Carmenère grape, and this latest affirms yet again the good results of its efforts.
