CHARDONNAY Valle de Limarí 2007

Wine Spectator Dec. 10 Insider Newsletter featured outstanding wines from Chile, including Terra Andina's Chardonnay Reserva from the Limarí Valley which earned 90 points.

Senior Editor James Molesworth's latest tasting notes on the wines of Chile's Maipo and Colchagua Valleys mentioned all the qualities of this wine with a retail price of US\$13, which is lower than all the other Chilean wines reviewed.

"Intense, with pear and quince notes that are ripe but racy, offset by a mouthwatering hint of lime and honeysuckle. The finish is long and juicy. Very tasty. Tasted twice with consistent notes. Winemaker Stefano Gandolini of Argentina's Viña Doña Paula oversees production here. Drink now through 2010", mentioned Molesworth.

Terra Andina's 2007 Chardonnay Reserva was made with 100% Chardonnay grapes from Chile's celebrated Limarí Valley. The wine was fermented in new and second - use French oak barrels and was kept on its lees for several months to enhance its character and increase its body.

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
